Talking of signage, we've been busy putting up new ones in our car park and on the Pavilion. More will be going up throughout the village over the next few months.



Now the foundations have been finished on the McCarthy & Stone site, there has been a lull in work as checks are being done by the Environment Agency and permissions are awaited.

I think we've all got used to seeing the discarded small gas canisters which have been used as recreational drugs.

I find it alarming that there have been at least 2 of this much larger version found in the village.

We ask parents to be aware of what their children are ordering on line or storing at home.

The Royal College of Nursing claims nitrous oxide is often seen as being low risk and offering a short, harmless burst of euphoria. But the Office for National Statistics data shows there were 25 deaths directly linked to the gas between 2010 and 2016.

According to the anti-drugs campaign Talk to Frank, the risks of inhaling nitrous oxide include:

- Dizziness, which might make you act carelessly or dangerously
- Heavy regular use can lead to a deficiency of vitamin B12 and to a form of anaemia
- Severe B12 deficiency can lead to serious nerve damage, causing tingling and numbness in the fingers and toes. This can be very painful and make walking difficult
- Regular use can stop you forming white blood cells properly
- It can be hard to judge the amount to use safely
- If you have too much you can end up fainting, having an accident or worse.

I was delighted to hear the news that contactless ticketing is coming to Dunton Green later this year. However, I am concerned after seeing this comment on the letters page of The Sevenoaks Chronicle.

Although DGPC has no remit on public transport issues we will try and keep parishioners aware of the full situation about use of rail cards when contactless arrives.



The school summer holidays often bring a rise in antisocial behaviour. Unfortunately, the vandalism on the station and the damage to the ski stepper outdoor gym equipment in the recreation ground were far worse than average. The defibrillator cabinet on the Village Hall was also broken off the wall.



Both cream pedals should be facing the ground. A great deal of deliberate force was needed to cause this damage.



To end on a more positive note, we are well into our plans for Christmas. Our traditional sing a long will be on Friday 15th December. Before then we will be planting a large permanent Christmas tree and hope to have a much improved Christmas light display throughout December.

FIVE PUBLIC ACCESS DEFIBRILLATORS FOR DUNTON GREEN

Dunton Green Parish Council has purchased, installed and will manage ongoing a FIFTH Public Access Defibrillator (PAD) for the benefit of residents in Dunton Green.

This time we thank The Miners Arms for their support of the Parish Council's project to see defibrillators covering more areas of the village, by allowing us to install the cabinet and defib on the front of the pub.



This new defibrillator is in addition to ones the Parish Council has already installed and maintains around Dunton Green:

- The Broadway Shopping parade (thank you to The Bed Post),
- Dunton Green Village Hall (thanks to the Management Committee),
- The Gym Building at Ryewood (thanks to Berkeley Homes)
- Dunton Green Pavilion in the recreation ground



We also thank the Sevenoaks Community Responders who check the defibs regularly for us (in addition to our own weekly checks). The Parish Council takes its responsibility for these units seriously: they are registered on The Circuit which is the national database that the emergency services use to advise people where a defib is near; we replace batteries and pads before they expire and we monitor their status weekly.

We hope you never need to make use of these pieces of kit, but they are there in case of emergency. **ALWAYS** call 999 **FIRST** and start CPR if you believe someone has had a cardiac arrest.

SATURDAY FREIGHTER GUIDANCE

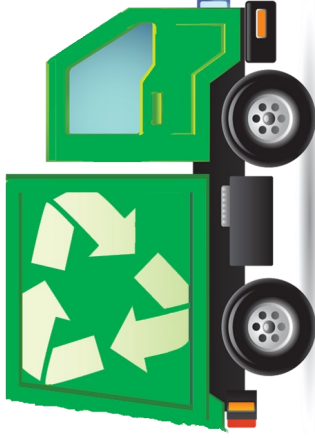
The Freighter cannot accept **white goods**, washing machines, dishwashers, fridges, freezers, cookers, cast iron boilers or baths, long metal poles, building materials, manure, large parts of engines or vehicles or hazardous waste.

Hazardous waste now includes items like fluorescent tubes, televisions & computer monitors, batteries, oil tins and filters, paint and paint tins and chemical containers. These items **cannot** be accepted on the Saturday Freighter service and must be taken to your nearest Household Waste Recycling Centre.

Compostable garden waste cannot be accepted.

Dunton Green Primary School Update

It was with great sadness that Dunton Green Primary School said goodbye to its head teacher Ms Boanas at the end of the summer term. Ms Boanas had been head teacher of the school



for over 6 years and the school went from strength to strength under her leadership.

We also said goodbye to Mrs Shaw after 23 years' service and Mrs Bett after 15 years at Dunton Green .

They will be sorely missed and their length of service is

testament to the dedication to and affection with which they hold the children at Dunton Green.

Over the years, the school has won several awards and accolades but the best praise we have received has been the countless emails from members of the public praising the children for their impeccable manners and for demonstrating the school's core values.

We are very proud of the children's achievements again this year with children who follow through from Reception to Year 6 at Dunton Green highly likely to meet age expected standards by the end of Key Stage 2.

Despite the setting of a very difficult SATs reading paper this year our year 6 children achieved 75% expected which is above the national figure and almost a third of the class passed at greater depth. This is despite having spent two years of their education in a global pandemic, we are so very proud of them. Our SPAG (spelling, grammar and punctuation) results were also above the national average.

We have had a full and fun packed summer term – events included the Districts Sports Tournament where Dunton Green pupils competed against other schools in the Sevenoaks Partnership and came 3rd! We were very proud of the children's sportsmanship and achievement.

Our Forest School has continued to evolve and grow, literally, and the children love getting mucky....



The Summer Fair was again a very popular event as was the end of year BBQ which were organised by the Parent Teacher Association, aka Team DG. We are very grateful to them for their energy and passion, giving up their time for the good of all the children at Dunton Green.



We would like to pay tribute to all the dedicated and committed people who make Dunton Green School the place it is – the staff, the pupils and parents and the volunteers, from the ‘readers’, adults who go on class trips to our wonderful trio who have helped transform the Forest school and other areas of the grounds.

We now look forward to the new academic year and welcoming our new Head teacher Mr Ben Hulme.

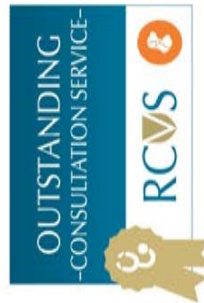

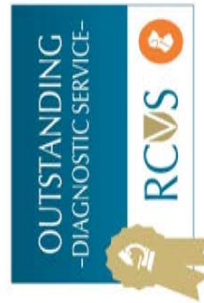
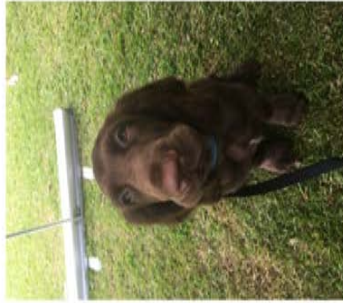

SPEEDING IN DUNTON GREEN

Speeding is a perennial issue through the village and something that causes concern for residents.

The Parish Council has worked with KCC Highways and has acquired a number of posters and banners that it will be putting up in various places to encourage more considerate driving through the village.

We also have 30mph wheelie bin stickers which we would encourage anyone that does have a wheelie bin to use. Please contact us if you would like some! (Contact details page 2).

Many statistics support the fact that you are much more likely to have an

accident close to home and so we urge all Dunton Green residents to watch their speed through the village to ensure the safety of neighbours, other road users and pedestrians.

The Parish Council is also working with KCC Highways to see if we can have 20mph indicators either side of the school, to be used during school hours, to help slow the traffic in the centre of the village when our primary school children are potentially more at risk.

Community Speedwatch is also an option to help monitor traffic in the village but it requires support from the wider community to run it. The Parish Council can help in terms of equipment but we do not have the resource to run it alone. We understand that one or two people may have registered interest but the scheme is not up and running in yet. **Take a look at**

SLOWER IS SAFER

The faster we drive, the greater our risk of crashing, and the harder we hit if we crash. A crash at 30mph has twice the energy and destructive potential of a crash at 20mph.

SHORTER STOPPING DISTANCES

The faster a vehicle is travelling, the longer it takes to stop. At higher speeds, a driver has less time to react and stop in time in an emergency.

LIMITS NOT TARGETS

The speed limit is the top speed for any particular road, but it is often safer to travel at much lower speeds, especially in places where people walk and cycle.

SAFE SPEEDS

Safe speeds reduce the risk of road death and injury and enable more people to make safe and healthy journeys on foot and by bike

VEHICLE TECHNOLOGY

Intelligent speed assistance (ISA) can help keep drivers within speed limits.

SPEEDING DRIVERS SHOULD EXPECT TO BE CAUGHT

We need comprehensive speed enforcement and investment in roads policing to catch speeding drivers and deter people from speeding.

RURAL ROADS ARE NOT RACETRACKS

Narrow, bendy roads often lack pavements or cycle paths and are unsuited to high speeds.

HAPPY, HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

Where traffic is slow, more people choose to walk or cycle. 20mph is an appropriate maximum speed in places where people live.

ROAD DESIGN

Traffic lights, roundabouts, speed bumps and rumble strips help slow traffic down.

Why do we need safe speeds?

Speed is a factor in many crashes and effective speed management is a crucial part of the safe systems approach to road safety – a shared approach to prevent death and serious injury from road crashes.

Safe speeds save lives

We might say it's ok to speed because everyone else is doing it. But if we all drive too fast, we collectively increase the risk of crashes on our roads, and we increase the risk of someone that we love being involved in a crash.

PARISH COUNCIL News Highlights



◆ **Signage** New signs have been installed at the recreation ground car park and on the Dunton Green Pavilion building.



◆ **Over the next month we are plan to install additional signage** around the village on land that the Parish Council owns and/or maintains.

◆ **A project to install independent electricity supplies on the village green has commenced, after a site visit by UKPN.** This will allow the Parish Council to more effectively provide Christmas lights on the Christmas Tree and more Christmas lights in the area generally. It will also support the use of a PA system for the Christmas Singalong. If successful we may be able to introduce lighting at other times of the year too.



◆ **A piece of outdoor play equipment is to be replaced after vandalism.** The ski stepper at the recreation ground has now been damaged on several occasions and the Parish Council is investigating whether an alternative piece of kit might be more robust. It is hoped to get something installed in the autumn.

baskets at Longford Meadow. To

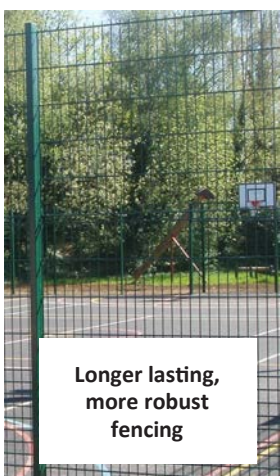
help fund this, an application has been submitted to SDC for a grant from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund. The Parish Council is waiting to find out whether that application has been successful.
